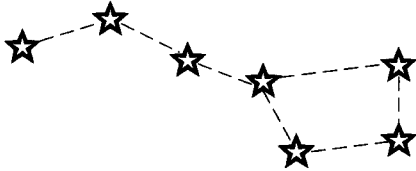


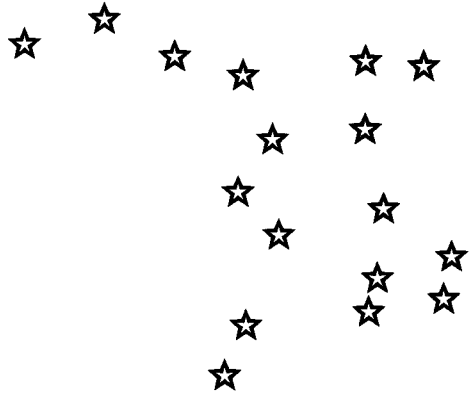
# Pictures in the Sky

Draw outlines of the following constellations.

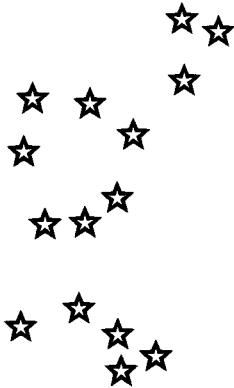
Begin with the Big Dipper, a group of seven stars.



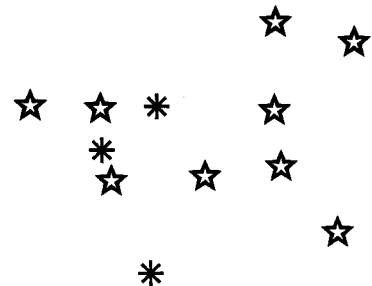
Around the Big Dipper, draw lines to form a bear. This is the Great Bear constellation.



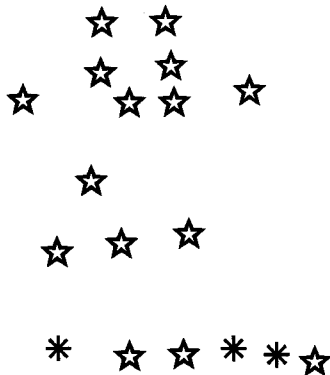
The Herdsman is not far from the Great Bear.
